2. Rôle description

Introduction

The support to TAP C19RM project management will support the coordination and consolidation of Technical Advice and Partnerships department (TAP) reviews on COVID 19 Response Mechanism by keeping the oversight of the various country funding requests (FRs) reviews that the different technical teams in TAP are doing. They will support the TAP teams in coordinating, reviewing, and providing feedback on C19RM full FRs by consolidation of TAP team feedback into an overall aligned TAP feedback, and facilitating a consolidated dialogue with the Country Teams (CTs) if needed.

Background

Known as C19RM, the COVID-19 Response Mechanism supports countries to respond to urgent needs to respond to COVID19, to mitigate the impact of COVID-19 on programs to fight HIV, Tuberculosis, and Malaria, and supports urgent improvements in health and community systems. All countries, including regional/multi-country recipients, that are currently receiving funding from the Global Fund, are eligible to receive C19RM funding.

To ensure quick implementation of the grants, FRs have a very short review cycle. During this cycle, technical teams review the FR and share their observations, recommendations, and proposed conditions.

Within TAP, there are different technical teams: the diseases teams (HIV, TB and malaria), the RSSH team and the MECA team. All these teams provide their own review on the FR based on their focus. However, TAP needs to provide an aligned review from TAP overall. Consolidation of the different TAP reviews for each FR is therefore a critical task

Scope/Objective

The overarching purpose of this support is to make sure that TAP provides timely, qualitative, and aligned reviews on the FRs. The consolidated input on the RRF (Review and Recommendation Form) is being used by the C19RM Investment Committee (IC). The C19RM IC will consider TAPs input (next to other input) in determining funding awards or recommendations.

Tasks

<u>Project manage consolidation of TAP reviews</u>

- Work together with TAP management team to streamline review process for the different FRs with different TAP reviewers
- Assure guiding principles for filling in the TAP internal assessment from: clearly communicated with TAP reviewers and further optimize SOPs (Standard Operating Procedures) as needed
- Provide communication on deadlines for the TAP reviewers, send timely reminders and actively follow-up with TAP reviewers that didn't hand in their review on time
- Identify quick wins to optimize the overall review process further and collaborate with the C19RM Secretariat to implement those
- Inform C19RM secretariat on review progress or delays
- Join pre-IC (Investment Committee) meetings to provide summary of TAP's review of C19RM FRs. Pre-IC meetings are with CTs and technical reviewers to prepare for the IC
- Brief department head and others on the TAP feedback on C19RM FRs

Facilitate a consolidated dialogue between technical teams with CTs and across the GF secretariat:

- Link the CT or other GF teams with the relevant TAP reviewers of the FR where needed.
- Get timely input from reviewers on their questions for CTs and send reminders if needed
- Decide if discussion with CTs is needed and flag accordingly to the C19RM Secretariat
- Assure reviewers of different technical teams update their review timely (based on the CT dialogues). If reviewers
 update their review later than the deadline for the Review & Recommendation (R&R) form, assure that reviewers
 send a clear email with proposed changes in the internal assessment form and consequences for the R&R form.
 Update R&R form accordingly

Consolidate TAP team feedback into an overall aligned TAP feedback:

- Consolidate reviews from different teams into one TAP recommendation, making use of the wording in the boxes with "Succinct wording to include in the R&R form" that have been completed by the reviewers
- Follow-up with individual reviewers in case review doesn't have succinct wording that can be used for the R&R form
- Decide if a TAP alignment meeting is needed to align on contradicting recommendations by different TAP teams.
 In case of an alignment meeting, facilitate meeting and steer towards consolidated TAP view as outcome of the meeting

Indicator for success will be the smooth, qualitative, and timely review of FRs by TAP resulting in qualitative strong and aligned R&R forms.

Deliverables

Qualitative strong R&R forms for each FR, showing the aligned TAP recommendation and completed on time
